

ORDINANCE NO. 4237

**AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PUBLIC OFFENSES WITHIN THE
CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF INDEPENDENCE, KANSAS
AND INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE "UNIFORM PUBLIC OFFENSE
CODE FOR KANSAS CITIES," 32ND EDITION, 2016
WITH CERTAIN OMISSIONS**

Be it ordained by the Governing Body of the City of Independence, Kansas:

Section 1.

There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating public offenses within the corporate limits of the city that a certain code known as the Uniform Public Offense Code for Kansas Cities, 32nd Edition, 2016, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas, with the exception that Section 10.18 of said Uniform Public Offense Code is not adopted. No fewer than three copies of the Uniform Public Offense Code shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy as adopted by Ordinance Number 4237," and to which shall be attached a copy of this ordinance [Ordinance Number 4237], and filed with the city clerk to be open to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable hours. The police department, municipal judge and all administrative departments of the city charged with enforcement of the ordinance shall be supplied, at the cost of the city, such number of official copies of the Uniform Public Offense Code similarly marked, as may be deemed expedient.

Section 2.

Ordinance 4183 is repealed.

Section 3.


This Ordinance shall take effect upon its publication in the official city newspaper.

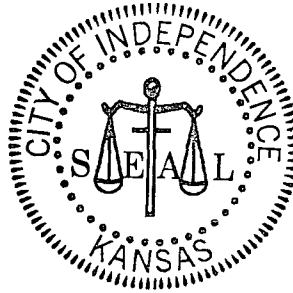



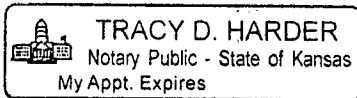

Be it ordained by the Governing Body of the City of Independence, Kansas: Section 1.

There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating public offenses within the corporate limits of the city that a certain code known as the Uniform Public Offense Code for Kansas Cities, 32nd Edition, 2016, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas, with the exception that Section 10. 18 of said Uniform Public Offense Code is not adopted.
